This is a recommended list of items you will need for most scout camping trips. Special events may have different requirements. Use common sense and your own judgment. If you have any questions as to what on this list to bring, refer to your Boy Scout Manual or check with your Patrol Leader.

## CLOTHING

- Full Class-A Uniform
- Class-B Tee Shirts
- Rugged Jeans
- Shorts (2 pair min.)
- T-shirts (2 min.)
- Underwear for Each Day + Extra
- Socks for Each Day + Extra
- Night Clothes
- Tennis Shoes
- Hiking Boots
- Water Shoes (no open toes)
- Jacket, Sweatshirt or Sweater
- Poncho or Rain Gear
- Brimmed Hat
- Handkerchiefs
- Garbage Bag for Dirty Clothes

## TOILETRIES

- Toothbrush & Toothpaste
- Soap
- Washcloth & Towel
- Comb
- Toilet Paper (partial roll)
- Sunblock
- Chapstick or Lip Balm
- Insect Repellent (no aerosol)
- Personal First Aid Kit
- Prescription Medications (Give to SM)

## GEAR

- Duffel Bag
- Day Pack
- Sleeping Bag
- Sleeping Pad
- Ground Cloth or Tarp
- Drinking Cup w/Closed Handle
- Water Bottle
- Mess Kit
- Boy Scout or Basic Swiss Pocket Knife
- Flashlight + Extra Batteries & Bulbs
- Compass
- Whistle
- Nylon Braided or Paracord (50 ft.)
- Small Roll of Duct Tape
- Camp Chair or Stool

## UNAUTHORIZED EQUIPMENT:
